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| Safe Crisis Management | Through regularly scheduled training opportunities, intermediate unit and district staff can access Safe Crisis Management training. Participants in the Safe Crisis Management Program will: Explore the nature and dynamics of acting-out behavior and become familiar with current and accepted non-physical and physical interventions Be introduced to crisis management regulations affecting their job responsibilities Identify positive prevention strategies that will reduce the frequency and intensity of acting-out behaviors Identify personal counter aggressive tendencies and learn how to control them Demonstrate emergency safety physical interventions based on "The Least Restrictive Alternative" List and define the risk and safety issues associated with physical intervention Clearly identify the monitoring responsibilities that are required during Emergency Safety Interventions Identify and describe the components of Tertiary Procedures: Provide for medical assessment Provide for mental health assessment Demonstrate the understanding of skills needed to resolve incidents (including debriefing and restoration) Identify the components of correct documentation, including the statewide mandatory reporting process. This service provides training for both initial certification (18 hours) and for recertification (12 hours) in Safe Crisis Management (SCM). The training schedule can be accessed on 48 Carats.
