Executive Director's Report October 27, 2011

The CAIU Superintendents' Fall Leadership Conference was held from October 25-27, 2011, in Annapolis, MD. Amy Morton, Deputy Secretary for Elementary and Secondary Education, reviewed key PDE initiatives. Rob Mancabelli, co-author of Personal Learning Networks: Using the Power of Connections to Transform Education, presented insights into Twenty-First Century learning, strategies for engaging stakeholders and methods for transforming organizations. Superintendents were provided an opportunity to review the data gathered from the Regional Cost Savings Strategies implemented last year and give input for the future. The entire cost of the conference except for transportation and parking was paid for by sponsors.

CASA Walk was held on Friday October 14, 2011. The students of the Capital Area School for the students of the Capital Area School for the Arts participated in their fifth annual Walk for Arts Education. <u>Desktop Virtualization</u> - Derry Township and the CAIU have entered into a pilot to implement a virtual desktop environment and utilize the current RWAN infrastructure. Virtual desktops will enable Derry Township's computers to access a Windows desktop from a server at the CAIU. This solution will help with cutting costs for Derry by not having to replace old computers since access to virtual desktops does not depend greatly on the speed of the computer. When a student brings in a device from home (Windows laptop, Macintosh, iPad, Android tablet or iPhone), the student will be able to get to the resources they need by accessing a district's preconfigured desktop on a CAIU server and this will also provide for greater security. The CAIU commends Derry Township for being leaders in this area.

<u>iPad 2 Elementary Integration</u> - Five second grade teachers from five different school districts Big Spring, South Middleton, Greenwood, West Shore and Camp Hill are piloting this initiative. The objectives of this pilot are to explore innovative ways to utilize iPads as instructional tools, focus on iPad use in centers and small group settings and utilize educational Apps to engage students, reinforce skills and accelerate learning

<u>Hybrid Learning</u> – Hybrid learning is the integration of traditional teaching with digital learning inside the school building. It empowers students to learn at their own pace, enables teachers to provide differentiated instruction and allow administrators to measure the impact of technology investments on student achievement. CAIU is one of five intermediate units piloting this program.
